New Vaccine Used

For the first time the new bivalent oral vaccine to stop the "transition" of both type 1 and type 3 wild polio. The vaccine made its debut during the December 15-17th National Immunization Days NIDs in Afghanistan.

D-5970 Haiti Disaster Response

On January 12th Haiti was hit with a 7.0 earthquake resulting in devastation hard to fathom. We've all seen pictures of the human loss of life and injuries as well as the property damage. On the 21st the board of

directors approved and endorsed a district project of supporting ShelterBox. Additional

ShelterBox provides a 110 lb polyurethane box supplying the immediate needs for a family of 10. The contents are primarily for providing the basic needs of shelter and water. Here's a partial list of items in each box :or 2 tents for 10 people each, sleeping bags, blankets, water purification tablets (1800gals), water purification kit, water container/carriers, collapsible trenching shovel, multi-fueled cook stove, eating utensils, rope, repellent mosquito netting, children's activity kit and other items. Each box costs \$1000.

Details about our district's match for any club or individual that donate to ShelterBox was in an e-mail sent to club presidents and secretaries. The details and the amount DDF funds that will be determined at the Jan 27th board meeting. There will probably be a deadline for the donations to qualify for the match of either \$ for \$ or \$1 for every \$2 donated. Donations should be made payable to ShelterBox and your club's donation should be send to District Exec Secretary John Last so we can get the cumulative response of District 5970.
